STATE, LOCAL, AND LIVESTOCK RULES: Please see 2010 State Rules for California Fairs available at the Fair Office or at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net. All Local and General Livestock Rules apply to all livestock departments. **Unless Local Rules are more restrictive, State rules supersede. See individual livestock species for additional rules.**

Entry Information:

Exhibitors must fill in official entry form. Please see page 9 for further instructions. All Livestock Entry Forms must be in the Fair Office or postmarked by **WEDNESDAY, JULY 14TH AT 5 PM UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.**

Include the following entry information:

(1) Owner's Name, Address, Phone number, Email (if applicable); (2) Breed; (3) Name of Animal; (4) Sex, and (5) Date and Year of Birth

****An Exhibitor's signature on the Entry Form signifies acceptance of the rules and schedules governing the Plumas-Sierra County Fair****

- Fair, Livestock, and Horse Show Management are not responsible for finding errors in entries.
- No animal shall be entered in both market and feeder classes.
- One market animal per exhibitor.
- A copy of the bill of sale is required to accompany all market animal livestock entries. The bill of sale must be from your breeder or who you purchased the animal from and include: Name, Address, Phone Number, Date you purchased the animal, breed, animal species, sex, I.D., if any (sheep – scrapies tag #, hog – ear notching, cattle – tattoo, brand or ear tag/mark), the price you paid for it and the sellers signature.
- If you are the breeder, a breeder's statement is required to accompany all market animal livestock entries. The breeders statement form is available at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net.

Entry Refunds: Refer to page 9.

Registration Papers:

Original registered papers must be presented to management for all registered animals prior to showing.

Photo copies ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE for any purpose in any division or department other than the Horse Show Divisions.

Livestock Accommodations:

Accommodations will be assigned by management **and are tentative pending the arrival of all animals. Stall changes may occur up to 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday.**

Range cattle pens may be available to ALL beef exhibitors for \$25.00 and is subject to availability. This would be for night penning and/or exercise and is at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent and Fair Management. Pens must be cleaned prior to departure from the fairgrounds or a cleaning fee may be imposed. Cattle are only allowed in pens AFTER 9:00 PM.

Cattle grooming chutes may be allowed in the barns if space is available to all clubs and chapters and is done in the assigned area and is supervised by an Advisor or Project Leader. This is at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent and Fair Management.

The management reserves the right to refuse entries when facilities are filled.

Exercise of animal must be done prior to 10:00 a.m. Your animal is required to stay in assigned pen.

Arrival:

No livestock arrival prior to 5:00 AM Monday, August 9, 2010

Cleanliness:

Livestock pens and stalls must be cleaned prior to 9:00 AM each day and kept clean throughout the day.

All exhibitors must be neatly attired and conduct themselves in a quiet, orderly manner.

All water hoses must have an automatic shutoff nozzle attached to it!

Feed and Bedding:

EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING ALL BEDDING FOR LIVESTOCK.

Straw and Chips can be used as bedding in all barns. **ONLY REASONABLE AMOUNTS WILL BE ALLOWED.**

When cleaning pens all bedding materials must be disposed of in manure bins. Do not deposit garbage in manure bins.

Accident or Loss Responsibility:

The Fair and Management will not be responsible for any damage, fire, theft, or accident that may happen on the fairgrounds. Exhibition of livestock is at owner or participant's risk. Signing the entry blank indemnifies Plumas/Sierra County Fair and the State of California against all legal proceedings.

Liability Insurance:

County, District and State Fairs cannot legally carry liability insurance covering exhibitors and/or their exhibits. Liability insurance is the responsibility of and at the discretion of the Exhibitor. Insurance may be purchased through CFSA, contact the Fair Office.

Vet/Health Check:

Beginning August 9, 2010 through the duration of the fair there will be random vet/health checks of all livestock.

If you observe an animal that appears sick or diseased, please report it to the livestock office at once.

Official Fair Veterinarian:

The Plumas-Sierra County Fair and the Official Fair Veterinarian DOES NOT provide veterinary services free of charge nor does it assume financial responsibility for sick or injured animals. **The owner will be responsible for any fees incurred due at time of treatment.** Decisions of Official Fair Veterinarian are final and uncontestable.

Unruly Animals:

For public safety, the Livestock Superintendent or Fair Management may disqualify an unruly animal at any time; such animal will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately.

General Horse Show Rules

STATE, LOCAL, AND LIVESTOCK RULES: Please see current State Rules for California Fairs available at the Fair Office or at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net. The Local Rules, the General Livestock Rules, Section XII, Horse Show Rules, of the California Fairs State Rules, available at the Fair Office or at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net, will apply as Rules for all Plumas-Sierra Co. Fair Horse Shows. U.S.E.F. rules and American Driving Society will be used (available in the Horse Show Office). All Local and General Livestock Rules apply to all livestock departments. **Unless Local Rules are more restrictive, State rules supersede.** SEE GENERAL LIVESTOCK GUIDELINES FOR ADDITIONAL RULES.

Decisions made by Show Management will be final.

Protests:

- Protests must be made in writing, with a \$100.00 deposit (Deposit will be refunded if upheld) must be turned in to Livestock Office within 24 hours of the alleged violation .
- Protest must be substantiated to Fair & Show Management. **The decision of Management regarding the protest shall be final.**
- The judge's decision can be protested if it is violation of the rules.
- The judges' or veterinarian's decision regarding the soundness of a horse CANNOT be protested.

Entries:

- **Only one entry form** must be filed for each horse - Gymkhana, 4-H/FFA, and Open Horse Show. Only one form required for driving pairs.
- Incorrect entries will be returned to exhibitor.
- **Refunds-** Full refunds will be given up to close of entries. After close of entry refunds will require a note from veterinarian or doctor for rider. During a show the Management or Judge may determine the unsoundness of horse and authorize refunds. Absolutely NO refunds for No Shows or Scratches.

- **Post Entries:** Post entries are accepted after closing date with a \$5 penalty per class in addition to the entry fee, regardless of whether or not the horse is already entered in the show. Post entries close when the preceding class has been called to the ring. Management reserves the right to limit entries at Management's discretion.

Drug Fees:

- Exhibitors of horses shall be subject to a Drug Testing Fee for each horse entered, and each horse will be subject to random testing to determine the presence of drugs that may alter the performance or disposition of the animal. A State mandated Drug Testing Fee of \$5.00 per horse will be charged for the entire event.

Box Stall Fees & Information:

- **STALLS & TACK STALLS ARE AVAILABLE ON A LIMITED BASIS. STABLING REQUESTS FOR SPECIFIC STALL WILL BE DETERMINED BY EARLIEST DATE OF ENTRY. PLEASE ENTER EARLY TO INSURE STALL ASSIGNMENT. Weekly stall rental will take priority over daily rental. Daily rental does not include overnight use.**
- Box stalls must be reserved at time of entry. Bedding will be available for purchase on site. Any exhibitor using a stall that has not been paid for will be charged double stall rent. Stall chart will be posted at the Horse Show Office. Do not move your horse to another stall without approval of the horse barn manager.
- **Barns available for check-in on Monday 8/9.**
- **Check out Saturday by 5:00 PM**
- **Day Use Stall Fee - \$ 12.00 No Overnight**
- **Weekly/Overnight Stall Fee - \$25.00 (no bedding provided)**
- **Tack Stall \$ 15.00, Limited number available**
- **NO REFUNDS FOR STALL FEES**

Class Size:

- A minimum of three (3) entries by two or more exhibitors are required for a class. Fair Management reserves the right to return entries, transfer or combine Divisions and/or Classes, and/or cancel any Division or Class in which entries are insufficient to secure an adequate competition. Age breaks may be adjusted after close of entries to equalize class size. Classes of 25 or more will be split and two sets of prizes awarded. Any return of entries under this rule must be done generally and without discrimination.

Junior Exhibitors:

- Fair Management WILL NOT ALLOW Junior Exhibitors to ride or show stallions.
- Age is determined as of January 1st of current year.
- **All Junior exhibitors, when mounted, entered in a 17 and under class, and all 4-H/FFA members are required to wear protective head gear and all adults are encouraged to wear protective head gear** which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/ SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted at all times while mounted anywhere on the fairgrounds. Any rider violating this rule at anytime will immediately be prohibited from further riding/driving until such headgear is in place. Riders/drivers failing to comply maybe eliminated from competition for the duration of the Fair without any refunds.

4-H/FFA Members:

- May show **only one** horse in the 4-H/FFA show.
- All horses and ponies must be owned or leased by the junior exhibitor and must be registered in their name only, no joint ownerships, joint projects or family farm/ranch names.
- 4-H/FFA riders may substitute a horse if their owned/leased horse becomes sick or injured and a veterinarian provides a letter stating such or at Fair Management's discretion. The rider will not be eligible for high point awards and ineligible to compete at state 4-H championship shows.
- 4-H/FFA Open Trail riders who are showing a 4-H/FFA market animal may arrange to ride their open trail horse class during another time slot if there is a conflict with their market animal class. Arrangement **MUST** be made **PRIOR** to Thursday morning. This is the **ONLY** conflict that will be accommodated.
- **All 4-H/FFA Department Rules apply to this division.**

4-H/FFA Attire:

- Wednesday's performance requires a 4-H or FFA uniform. Gymkhana riders entered in 4-H and open Gymkhana classes may wear Western attire.

High Point awards:

- Riders do not need to ride in all classes to qualify for high point awards. Points will be awarded in all classes listed.

Lead line class:

- Open to riders 7 and under. Riders in this class may not enter any other class at this show except halter, driving or showmanship.

Pee Wee division:

- Open to riders 9 and under. Riders in these

classes may not enter any other classes at this show except halter, driving, or showmanship. An adult may accompany participant into ring.

Beginning Rider Walk/Trot/Jog division

- Open to all ages. Riders in these classes may not enter any other classes at this show except halter, driving, or showmanship classes.

Rusty Stirrup/Jack Benny Classes:

- Open to riders born before 1969. Riders may enter any other class that they are eligible for. May be shown in English or Western attire.

Green Horse Walk/Trot/Jog

- Open to green horses in their first two years of showing regardless of age. May be shown in a snaffle, hackamore, or bit. May cross enter to other divisions except Pee Wee.

Novice Classes:

- Novice Riders may enter any Open classes that they are eligible for
- Novice Gymkhana is for riders that have never won 3 or more first places in ANY gymkhana event.
- Novice is not having won 3 blue ribbons in that class.
- Novice Horse is on the horse's record (follows from owner to owner – check with previous owner the horse's record).
- Novice Rider is the rider's record
- Honesty is appreciated.

Horse Soundness:

- All animals must be serviceable sound. Soundness of the animal as determined by the Official Veterinarian or Judge. The decision of the Judge or veterinarian shall be FINAL and NOT PROTESTABLE. A horse that is lame shall not be allowed to show.

Substitutions:

A horse may be substituted for a lame horse with \$5 penalty fee.

Class Calls:

- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have his/her horse ready at the gate for the start of their class. Efforts will be made to make barn calls.

Closed Arena:

- No horses are allowed in the arena after the arena has been prepared or while it is being prepared for a show. Trail course is only open during scheduled schooling times. Riders may be eliminated for failing to comply to schooling times.

Show Cancellation:

- Shows cancelled due to weather conditions or unforeseeable events will not be rescheduled because of other scheduled events.

Attire:

- Boots, long pants or breeches; collared shirt required in all classes. No tank tops or t-shirts.

Directions to the Fairgrounds:

- From **Reno**: Take US 395 North; Take HWY 70 west exit @Hallelujah Junction; in Quincy a) if you are staying for the **day**, turn right at Fairgrounds Road and then turn left at the Main Gate and proceed to the day parking area; b) if you are staying **overnight**, go past Fairgrounds Road, over the hill to the stoplight, turn right on Quincy Junction Road, turn right on Lee Road and proceed to the horse show gate and barns.
- From **Chico/Oroville**: Take HWY 70 east to Quincy, in Quincy, a) if you are staying for the **day**, turn left at Fairgrounds Road and then turn left at the Main Gate and proceed to the day parking area; b) if you are staying **overnight**, at the stoplight, turn left on Quincy Junction Road, turn right on Lee Road and proceed to the horse show gate and barns.

- Exhibitors of horses in livestock and horse shows will comply with the provisions of Horse Protection Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-540) and all rules adopted by the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture to carry out its provisions.
- 4-H/FFA members must show in 4-H/FFA Horse Showmanship to participate in 4-H/FFA Horse Show Classes. **4-H/FFA members may show a leased horse in showmanship and the 4-H/FFA Horse Show but not the Halter Horse Classes.**
- Horses are not required to remain on the fairgrounds during the fair to count for High Point.
- Trail Classes will start at 12:00 noon. Showmanship, halter and performance classes will start at 5:00 PM.

***Trail warm-ups are available for \$5.00 on Wednesday from 10:00 am – 11:30 am per 15-minute intervals at the Upper Arena. NO REFUNDS ON UNUSED TICKETS. Sign-ups will close at 11:15 am.**
