4 - H Guidelines

- **4-H Youth Programs** are non-formal, voluntary educational programs under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension - University of California and the U. S. Department of Agriculture. The projects exhibited at Fairs by members of these groups are the results of their efforts under the supervision of volunteer adults. All entries must have been carried as regularly enrolled 4H projects for the year 2011- 2012 and must be listed as such in files of the Farm Advisor's Office in the Plumas/Sierra County 4-H office.

Eligibility and Age Requirements- Age requirements as of January 1st of the current year

All 4-H Members must meet the Plumas-Sierra 4-H Councils' requirements for Fair participation. Members must be active in Plumas or Sierra Counties.

Members must be 9 yrs. old as of January 1st in order to both show animals in the 4-H classes and sell them in the Junior Livestock Auction.

Junior Members- Ages 9-13 yrs.

Senior Members- Ages 14-19 yrs.

Primary Members- Age span is from 5 yrs. to 8 yrs. of age. Primary members may exhibit in special primary division and classes designated by the Fair. If you are registered by Sept. 1, 2011 you will remain a member until August 31, 2012. Ribbons will be awarded, no cash prizes.

- **Uniform:** Long or short-sleeve white shirt, white pants, blue jeans, white skirt, 4-H necktie or scarf and 4-H hat required for all members except first year members. **Uniform is mandatory to show at the Fair**

FFA Guidelines

- **Future Farmers of America (FFA)** is a national organization of students enrolled in high school, vocational, and agricultural classes.
- **FFA members** may participate in classes and

may exhibit as members to the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school. They must be in good standing with the local and state organization to be eligible to exhibit at the Fair. The FFA Show is limited to Plumas-Sierra High Schools.

- **FFA Uniform:** White pants, white dress shirt or blouse either short or long sleeves. Official FFA necktie for boys and the official FFA scarf for girls. Official FFA jacket is optional, but if not worn, an official emblem on the shirt is required. **Uniform is mandatory to show at the Fair**

Independent Junior Exhibitors

- Independent Junior exhibitors who are not affiliated with 4-H or FFA and must meet the following age requirements:

Exhibitor must be between 9 to 17 years of age as of January 1st of the current year.

Independent Junior exhibitors who have been 4-H or FFA Members within 60 days (for swine, sheep, or goats) or 120 days (for market beef cattle) prior to the Fair are not eligible to compete as an Independent Junior.

Independent Junior Exhibitors **entering market animals** must :

Own all Exhibits entered 60 days (120 days for Beef and Horses) prior to Opening Day of Fair. Provide Fair Management with a picture of the animal, with copy of Bill of Sale

For further instructions please see *General Rules and Regulations* below

Independent Junior exhibitors must have "on-grounds" supervision by a responsible adult. Junior Exhibitors of livestock must wear clean white shirt with white or blue jeans appropriate for showing livestock.

General Rules & Regulations

- All Local Rules and State Rules apply to this Department. Copies of the State Rules may be obtained at the Fair Office or at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net.
- **Entry forms** are to be signed by the 4-H or FFA member's Club/Chapter Advisor. Exhibitor's signature on the entry form(s) signify their acceptance of the guidelines, rules and regulations governing the 2012 Plumas-Sierra County Fair as printed in the official Exhibitor's Guide Book. A copy of Bill of Sale or Breeder's Statement **MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH ENTRY**. See Livestock Rules on Page 38 for details.

- **Late Entries:** Late entries will be accepted within one week of the posted closing of entries if a penalty of \$50.00 **per Division** is paid at the time of entry.
- To be eligible for Market Animal Classes the animals must have been weighed in at the **Mandatory Weigh-in** and tagged with an official Plumas-Sierra County Ear Tag.

Livestock Additional Rules

Please note that all CA state, local, general livestock, horse show, and Junior Livestock Auction Rules and Regulations apply to this section.

4-H/FFA Livestock/Horse Red Tag Policy :

Purpose: To ensure that livestock exhibited at the Plumas-Sierra County Fair are cared for and treated in a humane and ethical manner, and that livestock pens are suitable for public display.

Policy: Livestock exhibitors are solely responsible for the care of their animals. If the Barn Supervisor or Livestock Superintendent is aware of any livestock exhibit that is not being cared for in an ethical, humane manner, or maintained as determined by the livestock management staff, the following will occur:

The Barn Supervisor and Livestock Superintendent will determine the name and affiliation of the exhibitor.

A Red Tag, with the following information, will be affixed to the exhibitor's pen: exhibitors name, observed problem, date and time of the citation, and Livestock Superintendent or Barn Supervisor signature.

The exhibitor must contact the Livestock Superintendent within 12 hours of the citation being issued with an approved plan of action. Reasonable efforts will be made by the Livestock Superintendent or Barn Supervisor to contact the exhibitor's FFA advisor, 4-H Leader, Parent or Designee and make them aware of the situation resulting in the Red Tag citation.

Any exhibitor failing to make contact with the Livestock Superintendent or Barn Supervisor within 12 hours may be issued an automatic second Red Tag Citation.

Any exhibitor receiving two Red Tag citations during the Fair will be declared ineligible for further competition or selling at the Jr. Livestock Auction. The exhibitor will forfeit all fair premiums; awards earned, and are required to remove the animal exhibit from the Fairgrounds within 12 hours of notification.

Mandatory Livestock Exhibitor Meeting for all Livestock exhibitors to be held on Tuesday, August 7 at 1:00pm at the SPI Pavilion Show Ring. Exhibitors Packets will be handed out at this meeting. Small animal meeting will be held at 7:30pm at Ag Barn.

- **Mandatory Weigh-in and Official Tag-** All market animals must have been weighed-in and tagged at the Official Weigh-in June 2, 2012 (for sheep, swine, and goats) or April 7, 2012 (beef).
- **Vet - Health Check-In:** There will be random **Vet-health checks** of all animals beginning on Monday, August 6, 2012 and continuing until the end of Fair. If you observe an animal that appears sick or diseased, please report it to the Livestock Office at once.
- **Ownership:**
All **market swine, sheep, and goats** must be owned by and under the exhibitor's care and management 60 days prior to opening of the Fair. All **market beef** must be owned by and under the exhibitor's care and management 120 days prior to opening of the Fair. All **other animals** must be owned by and under the care of the exhibitor for 30 days prior to the opening day of Fair.
- **Ethical Code: It is exhibitors' responsibility to feed, clean, care for, and groom their own animals.** They shall refrain from accepting active assistance from adults and non-exhibiting youth unless the junior exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is only for instruction. Any violation, as determined by the Livestock Superintendent or Fair Management, will result in disqualification. **This policy will be strictly enforced.**
- **Registered and Grade Animals:** A permanent ear tag provided by exhibitor or tattoo is required in all grade or registered animals, except Horse, and must be shown on the entry form. Grade animals may not be shown in divisions for registered livestock. Animals that have been registered by a purebred association cannot be entered as a grade or unregistered animals.
- **Show Order Livestock:** Showmanship Classes will be completed first, followed by Market, Feeder, and Breeding Classes. 4-H starts in even years and FFA in odd years. Horse see Horse section Rules and Show Times.
- **Showmanship-** In order to show and sell the exhibitor must show in the age-appropriate

showmanship class.

- **Selection of Champion:** The top two animals in each Market or Breeding Class will compete for Grand and Reserve Champion with 4-H / FFA market animals being shown together. **All Market Champion and Reserve Champion animals must be sold at the Junior Livestock Auction.**
- **Market Animals:** An exhibitor may only exhibit one large market animal: one beef, one goat, one sheep, one hog, or one meat pen at the Fair. **If unsure which animal you will exhibit at the Fair:** All animals must have been weighed and tagged at Mandatory Weigh-in. Prior to entry closing date all animals must be entered with entry fees paid. Entry fee for non-competing animal(s) will NOT be refunded. Only ONE market animal of the entered animals may be weighed in, and exhibited at the Fair.
- **Weigh-In:**
No wet, overly stressed, or fatigued animals will be allowed on the scales. All animals must have been weighed and tagged at the Mandatory Weigh-in.
All market animals must have the official, original tag from weigh-in. It is your responsibility to secure a replacement tag and have it applied if your official, original tag was lost. Contact fair office for replacement details 283-6272.
Untagged animals are not eligible for weigh-in.
If any weight is contested, it must be done immediately. The animal will be taken off the scales, the scales re-balanced, and the animal weighed again. Under no circumstances shall the animal leave the scale area.
After Weigh-in, the Fair will divide animals according to Weight Class.
If market animals are not weighed between allotted times, they will be disqualified from showing and selling.
For the safety of exhibitors and animals during weigh-in, all sheep and goats must stay in their pens until all beef cattle have returned to their barns.
Beef - 7:00- 7:30 AM, Tuesday Aug. 7
Sheep and Goats - 7:45-8:45AM, Tues. Aug. 7
Swine - 8:45- 10:30 AM, Tuesday Aug. 7
- **Ineligible Jr. Market Livestock:** All animals receiving Not Market Ready and those not meeting eligibility requirements must be removed from the fairgrounds within 12 hours of the species

showmanship class ending

- Transportation slips are the responsibility of the exhibitor. A Fair livestock release slip must be obtained from the livestock office for all the livestock and tack.
- **Fans:** All livestock fans to be turned off by 10:00 p.m.
- **Release** - See specific species for release times. All livestock auction sale take home animals must receive a certificate from livestock office before 4:00 PM release. **If emergency release is required, a signed certificate must be obtained from the livestock superintendent or his/her designee. Non-compliance will result in forfeiting premiums and ineligibility to exhibit in next years Fair.**
- **Livestock Exhibits Clean Up and Release:** Fair will not be responsible for items left in barns. Exhibitors may not remove belongings, club signs, etc. until after Sunday, August 12, 2012 at 4:00 PM.

Showmanship Rules:

- **The animal the Junior Exhibitor intends to sell in the Jr. Livestock Auction must be shown in appropriate Showmanship Division and Class.**
- Age is determined as of Jan. 1st of current year.
- If exhibiting only breeding animals, the animal must be shown in the appropriate species showmanship class to qualify for Breeding Classes.
- A 4-H/FFA member may show a leased horse in Showmanship. Please check in the 4-H/FFA Horse Show Section for the Horse leasing qualifications.
- EXCEPTION: Illness of exhibitor, with a written note from physician, or 4-H member attending the 4-H State Leadership Conference excludes them from Showmanship, but the exhibitor's animal must be shown by a 4-H or FFA member in the Market Class.

- All clubs/chapters will automatically be entered in the Group of 3 if they have three.
- One entry per club or chapter.

<p>The Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Auction is conducted by the Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Sale Committee, a non-profit organization. The purpose of this organization is to support and promote the county-wide educational activities of the FFA, 4-H and Grange organization by promoting and administering the livestock auction of animals raised by club/chapter members. Copies of the Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Sale Committee Policy and Procedures are available through the Plumas-Sierra County Fair Main and /or Livestock Office.</p> <p><i>Inquires regarding the Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Auction should be directed to President, Lisa Smith, 284-6106</i></p>

- All **market beef** must be owned by and under the exhibitor's care and management 120 days prior to opening of the Fair.
- **Copy of Brand Inspection or Bill of Sale must be turned in with entry. Original must be turned into Livestock Office to receive Exhibitor Packet**
 - California origin cattle -
 - Brand Inspection Certificate in the exhibitor's name issued at time of original purchase or
 - Sale yard Out Billing in the Exhibitor's name or
 - Completed Bill of Sale with a state brand inspector's authorization of release for inspection at destination.
 - Out Of State Cattle-
 - Cattle originating from states requiring a brand inspection must be accompanied by a Brand Inspection Certificate in the Exhibitor's Name.
 - Cattle originating from states not requiring brand inspection must be accompanied by a health certificate or original Bill Of Sale in the Exhibitor's Name.
- **Mandatory breeding animal identification and paper registration check 3:30 PM on Tuesday. Be at your pens.**
- **Transportation slip is mandatory in transporting animals to the Fairgrounds. Forms are available on-line.**
- For safety, practice for beef show must take place in show ring.
- **For public safety all grooming must be on Lee Road side of barns.**
- **No feeding in wash racks**

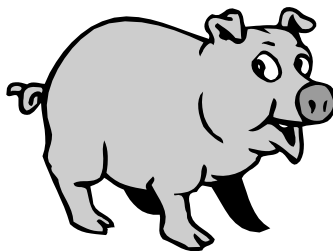

Please fill in scrapie information and or registration number located in the entry blank section of the entry form. PLEASE NOTE: Fair does not provide scrapie tags. Tags are to be obtained from the breeder.
- Must be slick sheared within ten (10) days prior to the fair weigh-in.
- **Tail docking:** To qualify for exhibit all market lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) is healed and can be lifted from the exterior. Lambs that have no dock will not be eligible. Inspection will take place at mandatory weigh in on market animals and at the fair on breeding animals.

ADDITIONAL GOAT SHOW RULES:

ALL GOATS MUST BE SCRAPIE TAGGED OR TATTOOED

- Registration tattoos or electronic I.D. are acceptable on goats provided the I.D. appears on the registration papers (and owner/exhibitor has reader if electronic I.D. is used). Exhibitor is responsible for ensuring availability of electronic reader. Tattoos may be placed in the tailhead or flank of goats that cannot be ear tagged or tattooed in the ears. Non-registered goats must have either a USDA premises ear tag or tattoo as official I.D. Contact the USDA at 877-741-3690 to obtain a Premise Identification Number. Please fill in Scrapie information page located in the entry blank section of the exhibit guide.
- Exhibitor must wear the assigned number for that goat or be disqualified.
- These animals can be Grade, registered purebred or unregistered purebred animals by a registered sire.
- Pygmy, Meat Goats, and Angora goats need not be dehorned.
- All male goats must be castrated.
- **Mandatory breeding animal identification and paper registration check 3:30 PM on Tuesday. Be at your pens.**
- **Maximum of eight goats per exhibitor may be entered. Only goats entered and shown are allowed on grounds.**

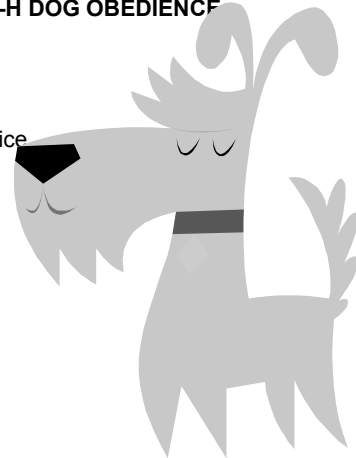

- Entry form must list the type of product (fruit, vegetables, preserves, etc. and the method of process used - canning or drying).
- Low-acid food must be canned under pressure.
- No paraffin seals. All canning exhibits must be in sealed jars.
- Dried products must be in zip-lock bags.
- An exhibit consists of **two** jars, containers or packages except jerky (six strips) and dried fruit (6 to 8 sections).
- Each entry must be a different product or the same product by a different method.
- Jar labels should list type of product and process (i.e. apricot jam - pectin method; apricot halves - water bath processed.)
- Clear glass wide or narrow mouth quart - pint or 1/2 pint mason jars (i.e. - fruits & vegetables - quart jars; jams & relish - pint or 1/2 pint jars.)

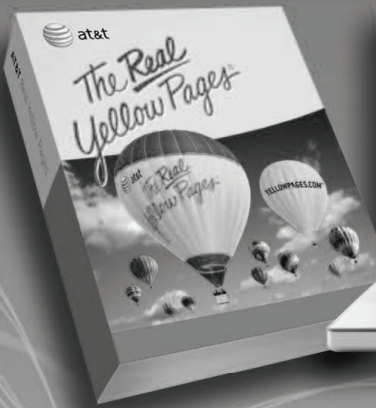
