**Organization and Family Outdoor Gardens Guidelines:**

- Open to all non-commercial organizations, such as clubs, churches, lodges or individuals in Plumas, Sierra & Lassen Counties.
- Plants may be grown in allotted space or in pots and transferred to garden area. No cut plant material allowed.
- Only qualified members of an organization or family may help to plan or participate in arrangement of garden.
- Space to be allocated in order of receipt of entries. The same space will be reserved for each individual or organization each year until May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Accessories used in Outdoor Gardens must remain in garden for duration of Fair. Removal after judging and prior to 8 PM Sunday, August 17, 2014 will result in a forfeiture of premium awards. Do not use accessories that cannot be replaced.
- All display materials must be age and content appropriate for families.
- Refer to Local Rules regarding theft/risk.
- After judging, the exhibit must display a sign (approximately 8" x 10"), giving the name of the individual or organization.
- The dividing fences and/or wall between booth spaces cannot be removed, cut down or painted. They may be covered with other material.

### **SILK FLOWER & DRIED MATERIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOLIAGE & FLOWERING POTTED PLANTS**

#### **Floriculture Department Guidelines:**

- All Local Rules and California Fair State Rules apply to this entire Department. Copies of the State Rules may be obtained at the Fair Office or [www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net](http://www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net).

#### **Showmanship:**

- Pick, transport and present flowers at the peak of perfection to the exhibit bench.
- *Please follow class guidelines carefully.* Please follow guidelines of class closely and time schedules. Loss of points or disqualification may occur. *See individual sections for further instructions.*
- All plants should be irrigated well ahead of cutting specimens. At cutting time, harden the stems in a cool place. Dust webs and soil particles from the flowers with a camel's hair brush.
- For potted plants remove all faded blossoms, dried or damaged leaves. Foliage should be clean, with a natural sheen and all pots be scrubbed clean. The pots should be in good proportion to the plants.

#### **Entries:**

Exhibits must be:

- Exhibitors – *Please use separate entry forms for each of the fresh arrangement shows.*
- Grown by the exhibitor within the county represented by the exhibitor in this department, except materials used for arrangements
- All **youth exhibitors** must be 17 years or under as of Jan. 1, of current year
- Exhibits must be correctly labeled.
- All exhibits will be judged together.
- Cut flowers and arrangements are open to individuals only – no clubs or organizations.
- Commercial florists and nurseries may exhibit plants, plant materials and flowers, which they currently sell but do not necessarily grow. Only persons licensed to sell nursery stock may sell plant materials, which have been incorporated in displays.

- Use a separate entry form when entering more than one category (i.e. entering arrangements, potted plants and cut flowers (both shows)).
- When entering and removing Floriculture exhibits use parking area behind the Floriculture Building and back entrance to the building.

- Entries will be judged according to the commercial maturity standards. The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural product exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market. Such exhibits must be as mature as that stage of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agriculture Code in order to be considered for premium awards. **Consideration will be given for fair time and expected maturity.**
- Exhibits stressing features, which detract from the commercial value of any produce, are undesirable and should be avoided. Any frozen fruit or vegetables will be disqualified.
- Unless otherwise specified, the type of vegetables desired for exhibit, will be a uniform commercial grade rather than overgrown. Monstrosities will not be considered for premium awards.

Section 42512 – Mature – having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.

Section 42515 – Overripe – having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.
