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## PLUMAS SIERRA COUNTY FAIR RULES

The Plumas-Sierra County Fair officially opens at Noon, on Thursday, July 25, 2024 and officially closes at 10:00 PM, Sunday, July 28, 2024.

Thursday is Seniors and Kids Day and admission is free for everyone 62+ years of age and 12 and under.

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### General Rules 2024 STATE, LOCAL, AND LIVESTOCK RULES:

Please see 2024 State Rules for California Fairs available at the Fair Office or at www.plumassierracountyfair.net. All Local and General Rules apply to all departments. Unless Local Rules are more restrictive, State rules supersede. See individual divisions for additional rules.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be aware of the applicable rules. There are changes from last year. Please review carefully.

#### DOGS:

NO DOGS ALLOWED ON FAIRGROUNDS, with the exception of official service dogs or those being exhibited for show.

BICYCLES: NO BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS, MOTORIZED SCOOTERS, OR HEELIES ALLOWED ON FAIRGROUNDS.

#### **AUTO PARKING:**

Automobiles may be parked in parking lots made available near the Main Entrance of the Fairgrounds. Throughout the Fair, all motorized vehicles MUST BE REMOVED FROM MAIN FAIRGROUNDS BY 11:00 AM with the exception of official vehicles and those parked in areas designated by Fair Management. NEW LIVESTOCK AND FAIR CAMPING POLICIES APPLY (SEE WEBSITE),

No Unauthorized Golf carts or ATV's are allowed on grounds.

UNAUTHORIZED VEHICLES ON THE FAIRGROUNDS AFTER 11:00 A.M. WILL BE TOWED AWAY. PLUMAS COUNTY CODE-ARTICLE 5, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 4, SECTION 4-3.509: (AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 87-682-DEC. 15, 1987) at the owners expense.

The Fair Manager is authorized to designate "NO PARKING" areas on the Fairgrounds which will be strictly enforced.

### **COMMUNICATIONS**:

As a courtesy to our Exhibitors, mail addressed in care of the Manager will be held until called for at the Fairgrounds Main Office.

### **SAFETY:**

Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Plumas-Sierra
County Fair, Management, Directors, Plumas
County and the State of CA from and against all
claims and demands, costs, charges and
expenses which he/she may incur, suffer or be
put to, by any reason of any accident, or any
person being injured or suffering damage.

### THEFT & RISK AND OR DAMAGE:

All entries shown at the exhibitor's risk. The Fair and Management is not responsible for any theft, loss, or damages while exhibits are on the grounds.

Each exhibitor is solely responsible for any loss, injury, damage, occurring to an exhibit, caused by any animal or other exhibit. Signing the Entry Form, indemnifies Plumas-Sierra County Fair, Management, Directors, Plumas County and the State of California against all legal proceedings. All exhibits entered shall be subject to the control of Fair Management.

The Fair will not assume any responsibility for exhibits left on Fairgrounds after the designated exhibit release time. NO EMPLOYEE OF THE FAIR HAS AUTHORITY TO CHANGE OR SUSPEND THIS RULE.

#### **CAMPING**:

Applications are available at www.plumassierracountyfair.net. Exhibitors MUST make prior arrangements with the Fair Management. A fee of \$ 150.00 will be paid for each campsite, along with an application for the Carnival Area and in the Lower Camp Ground for the duration of the Fair. NOTE: CARNIVAL - There will be NO Parking on the grass. ONLY ONE VEHICLE PER CAMP/RV SPACE WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARK IN DESIGNAT-ED AREA. Lower campground will be allowed one vehicle per camp/RV space. Campers will be allowed to park on Saturday and Sunday before the fair from 9:00 AM, till 6:00 PM., on Monday before the fair from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM. All camper parking will be at the discretion of fair management and not at the discretion of the exhibitor. Parking permits are to be picked up at livestock office before parking or settingup. No Refunds. Removal of carnival area campers begins on Sunday, July 28 from 3:00 to 5:30 PM and from 7:00 PM to 12 midnight.

### **General Entry Information**

### **ENTRY FORMS**:

Entry forms are available in the Premium Book, at the Fair Office & online at <a href="www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net">www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net</a>. Photocopies are acceptable.

SEPARATE ENTRY FORMS MUST BE USED FOR EACH DEPARTMENT ENTERED. INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Please see ENTRY DEADLINE for each specific Division's deadline. All completed entry forms must be filled out properly, signed and dated with required fees and turned into the Fair Office by 5:00 PM on the closing date of entries or postmarked no later than midnight on the closing date listed for each division.

An Exhibitor's signature on the Entry Form signifies acceptance of the rules and schedules governing the Plumas-Sierra County Fair.

Fair Management is not responsible for finding errors in entry forms. The Fair will be glad to assist in person or by telephone, any exhibitor who wishes help in filling out the entry form. Be certain to place your CORRECT MAILING ADDRESS (INCLUDING ZIP CODE) AND TELEPHONE NUMBER on entry form. Receipts will not be mailed and no refunds will be made under \$5.00.

#### **ENTRY FEES:**

Refer to the beginning of the specific department and division(s) you wish to enter.

#### A FEE OF \$25.00 WILL BE CHARGED FOR ANY RETURNED CHECK.

Entry & stall fees *MUST* accompany entry forms.

#### REFUNDS

Requests for refunds must be made in writing to the Fair no later than TEN (10) days after close of the Fair. Entry fees are non-refundable, except in special circumstances listed below. Refunds of

any kind will be granted only upon approval of the Fair Board of Directors and are made only because of sickness, accident, death, cancellation of a class, or return of entries for lack of exhibit space. In the case of illness of animals, a signed veterinarian's certificate stating that the animal in question is not fit to show due to illness or injury must be presented to Fair Management. There will be no refunds on any Stall Fees.

### **Exhibitor Definition**

### **ADULT OPEN DEPARTMENT:**

Adult Divisions are open to exhibitors of all ages, except for Youth Exhibitors who have divisions and classes available to them in the Youth Department.

Members of a family are considered one exhibitor and co-owners of exhibits. This includes mother, father, unmarried minor (under 18 years of age), children and minor foster children. In the Adult Open Department, classes that require that the exhibit be the creative work of the owner, husband and wife are considered separate exhibitors.

See Specific Division Sections for resident requirements. Local, Limited, & Open

Local – Plumas & Sierra Counties

Limited – Plumas, Sierra, Lassen, Butte & Tehama Counties

Open/Extended – A division or class open to legal residents or producers in the State of CA and any additional territory that may be specified in the local rules. Unless designated, all divisions are "extended" and limited to California and Western Nevada.

All 4-H Members must meet the Plumas-Sierra
4-H Councils' requirements for Fair
participation. Members must be active in Plumas
or Sierra County Clubs. Members must be 9 yrs.
old as of December 31st of prior year in order to
both show animals in the 4-H classes and sell
them in the Junior Livestock Auction.

Junior Members- Ages 9-13 yrs.

Senior Members- Ages 14-19 yrs.

Primary Members- Age span is from 5 yrs. to 8 yrs. of age. Primary members may exhibit in special primary division and classes designated by the Fair. If you are registered by Sept. 1, 2022 you will remain a member until August 31, 2023. Ribbons will be awarded, no cash prizes.

#### **FFA**

All FFA Members may participate in classes and may exhibit as members to the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school. They must be in good standing with the local and state organization to be eligible to exhibit at the Fair. The FFA Show is limited to Plumas-Sierra High Schools.

### **INDEPENDENT YOUTH EXHIBITORS**

Independent Youth exhibitors who are not 4-H or FFA members must meet the following age requirements:

Exhibitor must be between 9 to 17 years of age as of December 31st of the prior year and be residents of Plumas or Sierra Counties.

If exhibiting Livestock, refer to Livestock rules.

### **Exhibit Receiving, Judging &** Removal

#### **RECEIVING:**

See Specific Division Sections for receiving information.

It's the exhibitor's responsibility to have his/her exhibit(s) ready at the receiving times. Fair management has the right to limit facilities available and to CANCEL any Division or Class in which there are not sufficient entries for judging. Any return of entries under this rule will be done on a non-discriminatory basis.

#### **JUDGING:**

The Plumas Sierra County Fair Board has decided to institute American System of judging for older youth in all still entries. Check each category for clarification on which divisions will now be judged American System. Primaries and younger exhibitors will still be judged using the Danish System.

American – The judging process to rank exhibitors against one another and award one placing for first, second and third.

Danish - The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first placings, etc., as merited.

#### **MATERIALS:**

All materials and decorations in Still and Livestock exhibits must be made from flameproof materials or treated and maintained in flame retardant condition. This is in accordance with Section 13115 through 13119 of the Health & Safety Code, State of California.

### **EXHIBIT REMOVAL:**

See Specific Division Section for exhibit removal. No exhibits will be removed before release date and time.

#### RIBBONS:

Ribbon placement does not guarantee correct placing in judging. Only the official placing on the official judging sheet constitutes the final placement.

Ribbons will be placed on exhibits in some departments.

All other ribbon awards not placed on exhibits will be distributed by the department supervisor upon removal of exhibit(s) by the exhibitor.

#### PREMIUM CHECKS:

Premium checks will be made payable to the exhibitor in whose name the entry was made. Checks may be picked up from department supervisor on Monday, July 29, 2024, when removing the exhibits according to the Specific Division Section. They will be mailed to exhibitor's address as listed on entry form. Please allow four (4) weeks for receipt of premium checks after close of the Fair. Premium checks must be cashed within six months from date of issuance or they become **void.** NOTE: Premiums are paid according to official judges record sheets. Possession of a ribbon, tag, or card has no bearing on premium payment.

Fair Management may withhold payment of Awards for exhibits that are in question under State and Local Rules, and may recover awards that have been paid for entries in question.

No exhibitor shall receive more than two cash awards in any one class using American Judging System.

If you wish to donate your premium check to the Fair, it is greatly appreciated and will be used for the purchase of ribbons and other awards.

Exhibitors who's premiums exceed \$300 must by the Plumas County Auditor's office.

#### LATE ENTRIES:

Still Exhibits late entries will be accepted within one week of the posted closing of entries with a penalty of \$20.00 per class to be paid at time of entry.

NEW DIVISIONS AND CLASSES! - We added some new classes in all departments, so keep an eye out for new stuff! Here are a couple: we've added printmaking in the Art Barn, fresh wreaths and pressed flowers in Floriculture and professional divisions in our Home Brew and Wine department in Home Arts. We've also included a Mead class.

**HORSE SHOW** - There will be a 4-H Horse Show held on Sunday, July 14 that will count towards the Large Animal Round Robin. Equestrians can still compete under other classifications at the Horse Show held during the Fair. The Driving Show will be held in the Fall again; September 14. Also, we now offer a discount for getting your Horse Entries in early; July 12.

**OPEN POULTRY SHOW!** - Check out the details on page 27. We still have a Open Sheep show as well. Speaking of poultry, we have a new **inspection time for poultry**. Animals MUST be inspected before they can be brought onto the fairgrounds. Our new day and time is Tuesday, July 23 between 8am and 9am in the tent outside the front gate of the fair. We hope this is a more practical and convenient time for exhibitors, as well as less stress for the animals.

AUCTION BYLAW CHANGE - In order to sell an animal in the Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Auction, a youth exhibitor must be a resident of Plumas or Sierra County or have been enrolled in a school in Plumas or Sierra County the calendar year of the auction. Youth exhibitors, and their siblings, who sold in the 2022 Plumas-Sierra County Fair Junior Livestock Auction may continue to sell at future auctions in which they are otherwise eligible. Youth exhibitors must also be a member in good standing of a Plumas-Sierra County 4-H club, a Plumas or Sierra FFA chapter, or be an independent exhibitor who has met all requirements outlined in the PSJLA Policy & Procedures Appendix A. This took effect last year, but we thought we would leave it here as a reminder.

Professional – Artists engaging in an event or activity with an advanced level of skill, training, or experience are encouraged to enter the Professional category.

<u>Jr. High</u> - exhibitors in grades 7<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup> of current year. Age and grade level upon completion of project must appear on entry form.

Sr. High - exhibitors in grades 10 - 12 of current year.

**Exhibit Age Requirements** - All work must be entered in the name of the artist, completed in the last TWO YEARS, and not previously exhibited at the Plumas-Sierra County Fair.

<u>Display Only Exhibits</u> – In addition to exhibits entered for premium awards, artists are invited to display their work in the Art Barn "Courtesy Area" subject to space availability. Two exhibits per exhibitor. Please submit entry form with dimensions of artwork for Art Barn layout purposes.

<u>Unclaimed Exhibits</u> - Any Art, Crafts, or Photography left over thirty (30) days will become the property of Plumas-Sierra County Fair and will be sold with proceeds benefiting the Art Barn.

Judging - Judging in the Art Barn will be based on the American System of judging. This judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second, etc. To encourage high standards; the judge shall award first, second, third place, etc., according to merit. If without merit, the judge shall make no award under any circumstance. This applies whether there are one or more exhibits in class. The judge has the authority to disqualify or transfer to the correct class any exhibit that does not meet the requirements of the division or class in which it is entered.

<u>Measurement Requirements</u> – Measurements must be stated under description of entry on still entry form.



### **Entry Information:**

Exhibitors must fill in official entry form. Please see page 9 for further instructions. All Livestock Entry Forms must be in the Fair Office or postmarked by

### FRIDAY, JUNE 28 AT 5 PM UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

### Include the following entry information:

- (1) Owner's Name, Address, Phone number, Email (if applicable);
- (2) Breed; (3) Name of Animal; (4) Sex, and (5) Date and Year of Birth \*\*An Exhibitor's signature on the Entry Form signifies acceptance of the rules and schedules governing the Plumas-Sierra County Fair\*\*
- Fair, Livestock, and Horse Show Management are not responsible for finding errors in entries.
- No animal shall be shown in both market and feeder classes.
- A copy of the bill of sale is required to accompany all market animal livestock entries. The bill of sale must be from your breeder or who you purchased the animal from and include: Name, Address, Phone Number, Date you purchased the animal, breed, animal species, sex, I.D., if any (sheep scrapies tag #, hog ear notching, cattle tattoo, brand or ear tag/mark), the price you paid for it and the sellers signature. ATTENTION SWINE EXHIBITORS: Your Bill of Sale must state that your animal was raised in compliance with Proposition 12.
- If you are the breeder, a breeder's statement is required to accompany all market animal livestock entries. The breeders

statement form is available at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net.

#### **Registration Papers:**

Original registration papers must be presented to management for all registered animals prior to showing.

Photo copies ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE for any purpose in any division or department other than the Horse Show Divisions.

### **Livestock Accommodations:**

Accommodations will be assigned by management and are tentative pending the arrival of all animals. Stall changes may occur up to 5am on Tuesday, July 23

Range cattle pens may be available to ALL beef exhibitors for \$25.00 and is subject to availability. This would be for night penning and/or exercise and is at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent and Fair Management. Pens must be cleaned prior to departure from the fairgrounds or a cleaning fee may be imposed. Cattle are only allowed in pens AFTER 8:00 PM.

Cattle grooming chutes may be allowed in the barns if space is available to all clubs and chapters and is done in the assigned area and is supervised by an Advisor or Project Leader. This is at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent and Fair Management.

The management reserves the right to refuse entries when facilities are filled. Exercise of animal must be done prior to 10:00 a.m.

Your animal is required to stay in assigned pen.

Animals shall be moved back to the barns by 9:00 am daily.

#### **Arrival:**

No livestock arrival prior to 5:00 am Monday, July 22, 2024. All large livestock must be in place by noon on Tuesday, July 23, 2024.

### Cleanliness:

Livestock pens and stalls must be cleaned prior to 9:00 AM each day and kept clean throughout the day.

All exhibitors must be neatly attired and conduct themselves in a quiet, orderly manner.

#### All water hoses must have an automatic shutoff nozzle attached to it! Feed and Bedding:

## $\frac{\text{EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING ALL BEDDING}}{\text{FOR LIVESTOCK}}.$

Only shavings can be used as bedding in all barns. ONLY REASONABLE AMOUNTS WILL BE ALLOWED.

When cleaning pens all bedding materials must be disposed of in designated manure area. Do <u>not</u> deposit garbage in manure area.

### Accident or Loss Responsibility:

The Fair and Management will not be responsible for any damage, fire, theft, or accident that may happen on the fairgrounds. Exhibition of livestock is at owner or participant's risk.

Signing the entry blank indemnifies Plumas/Sierra County Fair and the State of California against all legal proceedings. *For further information see page 9*.

#### **Liability Insurance:**

County, District and State Fairs cannot legally carry liability insurance covering exhibitors and/or their exhibits. Liability insurance is the responsibility of and at the discretion of the Exhibitor. Insurance may be purchased through CFSA, contact the Fair Office.

#### Vet/Health Check:

Beginning July 22, 2024 through the duration of the fair there will be random vet/health checks of all livestock.

If you observe an animal that appears sick or diseased, please report it to the livestock office at once.

#### Official Fair Veterinarian:

The Plumas-Sierra County Fair and the Official Fair Veterinarian DOES NOT provide veterinary services free of charge nor does it assume financial responsibility for sick or injured animals. However, it is the prerogative of Fair management to call for veterinarian services when it feels the health and safety of any or all animals are at risk. If this is the case, the owner will be responsible for any fees incurred, due at time of treatment. Decisions of Official Fair Veterinarian are final and uncontestable.

### **Unruly Animals:**

For public safety, the Livestock Superintendent or Fair Management may disqualify an unruly animal at any time; such animal will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately.



The Local Rules, the General Livestock Rules, Section XII, Horse Show Rules, of the California Fairs State Rules, available at the Fair Office or at <a href="www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net">www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net</a>, will apply as Rules for all Plumas-Sierra Co. Fair Horse Shows. U.S.E.F. rules and American Driving Society will be used (available in the Horse Show Office). All Local and General Livestock Rules apply to all livestock departments. Unless Local Rules are more restrictive, State rules supersede. SEE GENERAL LIVESTOCK GUIDELINES FOR ADDITIONAL RULES. SEE AQHA RULES FOR RANCH VERSATILITY.

#### Decisions made by Show Management will be final.

#### **Protests:**

- Protests must be made in writing, with a \$500.00 deposit (Deposit will be refunded if upheld) must be turned in to Livestock Office within 24 hours of the alleged violation.
- Protest must be substantiated to Fair & Show Management. The decision of Management regarding the protest shall be final.
- The judge's decision can be protested if it is violation of the rules.
- The judges' or veterinarian's decision regarding the soundness of a horse CANNOT be protested.

#### **Entries:**

- Only one entry form must be filed for each horse 4-H/FFA, and Open Horse Show. Only one form required for driving pairs.
- Incorrect entries will be returned to exhibitor.
- Refunds- Full refunds will be given up to close of entries. After close of entry refunds will require a note from veterinarian or doctor for rider.

  During a show the Management or Judge may determine the unsoundness of horse and authorize refunds. Absolutely NO refunds for No Shows or Scratches.
- Early Registration: There is a \$2 discount for each class when you register before July 5, 2024.

#### **Drug Fees**:

Exhibitors of horses shall be subject to a Drug Testing Fee for each horse
entered, and each horse will be subject to random testing to determine the
presence of drugs that may alter the performance or disposition of the animal. A State mandated Drug Testing Fee of \$14.00 per horse will be
charged for the entire event.

### **Box Stall Fees & Information**:

#### Class Size:

 A minimum of three (3) entries by two or more exhibitors are required for a class. Fair Management reserves the right to return entries, transfer or combine Divisions and/or Classes, and/or cancel any Division or Class in which entries are insufficient to secure an adequate competition. Age breaks may be adjusted after close of entries to equalize class size. Any return of entries under this rule must be done generally and without discrimination.

#### Youth Exhibitors:

- Fair Management WILL NOT ALLOW Youth Exhibitors to ride or show stallions.
- Age is determined as of December 31st of prior year.
- All Youth exhibitors, when mounted, entered in a 17 and under class, and all 4-H/FFA members are required to wear protective head gear and all adults are encouraged to wear protective head gear which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/ SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted at all times while mounted anywhere on the fairgrounds. Any rider violating this rule at anytime will immediately be prohibited from further riding/driving until such headgear is in place. Riders/drivers failing to comply maybe eliminated from competition for the duration of the Fair without any refunds.

### **High Point awards**:

Riders do not need to ride in all classes to qualify for high point awards.
 Points will be awarded in all classes listed.

#### Lead Line class

 Open to riders 7 and under. Riders in this class may not enter any other class at this show except halter, driving or showmanship.

#### Pee Wee division:

 7 years and under; walk only; may have a handler in arena; no cross entries in other divisions.

### **Beginning Rider division**

 Youth only (under 18) first two years of showing; walk/trot; no cross entries in loping classes

#### Rusty Stirrup/Jack Benny Classes:

 Open to riders born before 1983. Riders may enter any other class that they are eligible for.

### Green Horse Walk/Trot/Jog:

Open to green horses in their first two years of showing regardless of age.
 May be shown in a snaffle, hackamore, or bit. May cross enter to other divisions except Pee Wee.

### Walk/Trot Open:

Any age level; no cross entry in loping classes; no high point awards

#### **English Only Classes:**

 Youth and adult division; English tack and attire; Hunter Hack included in highpoint

#### **Horse Soundness:**

All animals must be serviceable sound. Soundness of the animal as determined by the Official Veterinarian or Judge. The decision of the Judge or veterinarian shall be FINAL and NOT PROTESTABLE. A horse that is lame shall not be allowed to show.

#### **Substitutions:**

A horse may be substituted for a lame horse.

#### Class Calls:

 It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have his/her horse ready at the gate for the start of their class. Efforts will be made to make barn calls.

### **Closed Arena:**

No horses are allowed in the arena after the arena has been prepared or while it is being prepared for a show. Trail course is only open during scheduled schooling times. Riders may be eliminated for failing to comply to schooling times.

#### **Show Cancellation:**

 Shows cancelled due to weather conditions or unforeseeable events will not be rescheduled because of other scheduled events.

### Attire:

 Boots, long pants or breeches; collared shirt required in all classes. No tank tops or t-shirts.

#### **Directions to the Fairgrounds:**

### 4-H/FFA DEPARTMENT RULES

Limited to Plumas & Sierra County Organizations

### 4 - H Guidelines

4-H Youth Programs are non-formal, voluntary educational programs under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension - University of California and the U. S. Department of Agriculture. The projects exhibited at Fairs by members of these groups are the results of their efforts under the supervision of volunteer adults. All entries must have been carried as regularly enrolled 4H projects for the year 2023–24 with the Plumas-Sierra County 4-H office.

#### Eligibility and Age Requirements-

Age requirements as of December 31st of the prior year
All 4-H Members must meet the Plumas-Sierra 4-H Councils' requirements
for Fair participation. Members must be active in Plumas or Sierra Counties.
Members must be 9 yrs. old as of December 31st in order to both show
animals in the 4-H classes and sell them in the Junior Livestock Auction.

**Junior Members-** Ages 9-10 yrs. **Intermediate Members-** Ages 11-13 yrs.

Senior Members- Ages 14-19 yrs.

**Primary Members-** Age span is from 5 yrs. to 8 yrs. of age. Primary members may exhibit in special primary division and classes designated by the Fair. Ribbons will be awarded, no cash prizes.

 Uniform: The following attire is required as appropriate for showing livestock; long or short-sleeved white shirt; blue or white pants, any fabric, or white skirt. Wearing a 4-H hat and tie or scarf is highly encouraged.

#### FFA Guidelines

- Future Farmers of America (FFA) is a national organization of students enrolled in high school, vocational, and agricultural classes.
- FFA members may participate in classes and may exhibit as members to the
  end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school.
  They must be in good standing with the local and state organization to be
  eligible to exhibit at the Fair. The FFA Show is limited to Plumas-Sierra
  High Schools.
- FFA Uniform: White pants, white dress shirt or blouse either short or long sleeves. Official FFA necktie for boys and the official FFA scarf for girls. Official FFA jacket is optional, but if not worn, an official emblem on the shirt is required. Uniform is mandatory to show at the Fair

### **Independent Youth Exhibitors**

- Independent Youth exhibitors who are not affiliated with 4-H or FFA and must meet the following age requirements:
- Exhibitor must be between 9 to 17 years of age as of December 31st of the prior year.
- Independent Youth exhibitors who have been 4-H or FFA Members within 60 days (for swine, sheep, or goats) or 120 days (for market beef cattle) prior to the Fair are not eligible to compete as an Independent Junior.
- Independent Youth Exhibitors entering market animals must:
   Own all Exhibits entered 60 days (120 days for Beef and Horses) prior to Opening Day of Fair.
  - Be residents of Plumas or Sierra Counties.
- Provide Fair Management with a picture of the animal, with copy of Bill of Sale
- For further instructions please see General Rules and Regulations below
- Independent Youth exhibitors must have "on-grounds" supervision by a responsible adult.
- Youth Exhibitors of livestock must wear clean white shirt with white or blue jeans appropriate for showing livestock.

### **General Rules & Regulations**

- All Local Rules and State Rules apply to this Department. Copies of the State Rules may be obtained online at www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net.
- Entry forms are to be signed by the 4-H or FFA member's Club/Chapter Advisor. Exhibitor's signature on the entry form(s) signify their acceptance of the guidelines, rules and regulations governing the 2023 Plumas-Sierra County Fair as printed in the official Exhibitor's Guide Book. A copy of Bill of Sale or Breeder's Statement MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH ENTRY. See Livestock Rules on Page 26 for details.
- Late Entries: Late entries will be accepted within one week of the posted

- closing of entries if a penalty of \$50.00 *per Division* is paid at the time of entry.
- To be eligible for Market Animal Classes the animals must have been tagged with an official Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Committee Ear Tag prior to arriving on fairgrounds.
- QUALITY ASSURANCE AND ETHICAL TRAINING FOR LIVE-STOCK EXHIBITORS - All Junior Livestock Exhibitors must complete State approved training and provide a completion certificate with their entry.

### **Livestock Additional Rules**

\*\*Please note that all CA state, local, general livestock, horse show, and Junior Livestock Auction Rules and Regulations apply to this section.\*\*

### 4-H/FFA Livestock/Horse Red Tag Policy:

**Purpose:** To ensure that livestock exhibited at the Plumas-Sierra County Fair are cared for and treated in a humane and ethical manner, and that livestock pens are suitable for public display.

**Policy:** Livestock exhibitors are solely responsible for the care of their animals. If the Barn Supervisor or Livestock Superintendent is aware of any livestock exhibit that is not being cared for in an ethical, humane manner, or maintained as determined by the livestock management staff, the following will occur:

The Barn Supervisor and Livestock Superintendent will determine the name and affiliation of the exhibitor.

A Red Tag, with the following information, will be affixed to the exhibitor's pen: exhibitors name, observed problem, date and time of the citation, and Livestock Superintendent or Barn Supervisor signature.

The exhibitor must contact the Livestock Superintendent within 12 hours of the citation being issued with an approved plan of action. Reasonable efforts will be made by the Livestock Superintendent or Barn Supervisor to contact the exhibitor's FFA advisor, 4-H Leader, Parent or Designee and make them aware of the situation resulting in the Red Tag citation.

Any exhibitor failing to make contact with the Livestock Superintendent or Barn Supervisor within 12 hours may be issued an automatic second Red Tag Citation. Any exhibitor receiving two Red Tag citations during the Fair will be declared ineligible for further competition or selling at the Jr. Livestock Auction. The exhibitor will forfeit all fair premiums; awards earned, and are required to remove the animal exhibit from the Fairgrounds within 12 hours of notification.

# Mandatory Livestock Exhibitor Meeting Small Livestock exhibitors meet on Tuesday, July 23 at 1:00pm in the Jr. Ag Building. Large Animal exhibitors will meet Tuesday, July 23 after 2pm weigh in. Exhibitor Packets will be handed out at the Livestock Office following meetings.

Vet - Health Check-In: There will be random Vet-health checks of all animals beginning on Tuesday, July 23, 2024 and continuing until the end of Fair. If you observe an animal that appears sick or diseased, please report it to the Livestock Office immediately.

### - Ownership:

All **market swine**, **sheep**, **and goats** must be owned by and under the exhibitor's care and management 60 days prior to opening of the Fair. All **market beef** must be owned by and under the exhibitor's care and management 120 days prior to opening of the Fair.

All **other animals** must be owned by and under the care of the exhibitor for 30 days prior to the opening day of Fair.

- Ethical Code: It is exhibitors' responsibility to feed, clean, care for, and groom their own animals. They shall refrain from accepting active assistance from adults and non-exhibiting youth unless the junior exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is only for instruction. Any violation, as determined by the Livestock Superintendent or Fair Management, will result in disqualification. This policy will be strictly enforced.
- Registered and Grade Animals: A permanent ear tag provided by exhibitor or tattoo is required in all grade or registered animals, except Horse, and must be shown on the entry form. Grade animals may not be shown in divisions for registered livestock. Animals that have been registered by a purebred association cannot be entered as a grade or unregistered animals.

Show Order Livestock: Showmanship Classes will be completed first, followed by Market, Feeder, and Breeding Classes. 4-H starts in even years and FFA in odd years. Horse see Horse section Rules and Show Times.

Showmanship- In order to show and sell the exhibitor must show in the age

 appropriate showmanship class.

4-H Showmanship Order is Senior, Junior, and Beginning

FFA Showmanship all shown together

**Independents** not in high school will show in the appropriate 4-H age class. Independents that are high school age will show with the FFA.

- Selection of Champion: The top two animals in each Market or Breeding Class will compete for Grand and Reserve Champion with 4-H / FFA market animals being shown together. All Market Champion and Reserve Champion animals must be sold at the Junior Livestock Auction.
- Market Animals: An exhibitor may only exhibit one large market animal: one beef, one goat, one sheep, one hog, or one meat pen at the Fair. If unsure which animal you will exhibit at the Fair: Prior to entry closing date all animals must be entered with entry fees paid. Entry fee for noncompeting animal(s) will NOT be refunded. Only ONE market animal of the entered animals may be weighed in, and exhibited at the Fair.

#### Weigh-In

No wet, overly stressed, or fatigued animals will be allowed on the scales. All market animals must have the official, original tag. It is your responsibility to secure a replacement tag and have it applied if your official, original tag was lost. Contact Junior Livestock Committee for replacement details. **Untagged animals are not eligible for weigh-in.** 

If any weight is contested, it must be done immediately. The animal will be taken off the scales, the scales re-balanced, and the animal weighed again. Under no circumstances shall the animal leave the scale area.

After Weigh-in, the Fair will divide animals according to Weight Class. If market animals are not weighed between allotted times, they will be disqualified from showing and selling.

For the safety of exhibitors and animals during weigh-in, all sheep and goats must stay in their pens until all beef cattle have returned to their barns. Times are approximate.

Beef - 2:00– 2:30 PM, Tuesday July 23 Sheep and Goats - 2:45-3:45 PM, Tuesday July 23 Swine - 3:45– 4:30 PM, Tuesday July 23

- Ineligible Jr. Market Livestock: All animals receiving Not Market Ready and those not meeting eligibility requirements must be removed from the fairgrounds within 12 hours of the species showmanship class ending
- Transportation slips are the responsibility of the exhibitor. A Fair livestock release slip must be obtained from livestock office for all livestock & tack.
- Fans: All livestock fans to be turned off by 10:00 p.m.
- Release See specific species for release times. All livestock auction sale take home animals must receive a certificate from livestock office before 4:00 PM release. If emergency release is required, a signed certificate must be obtained from the livestock superintendent or his/her designee. Non-compliance will result in forfeiting premiums and ineligibility to exhibit in next years Fair.
- Livestock Exhibits Clean Up and Release: Fair will not be responsible for items left in barns. Exhibitors may not remove belongings, club signs, etc. until after Sunday, July 29, 2024 at 4:00 PM.

### **Showmanship Rules:**

- The animal the Junior Exhibitor intends to sell in the Jr. Livestock Auction must be shown in appropriate Showmanship Division and Class
- Age is determined as of December 31st of prior year.
- If exhibiting only breeding animals, the animal must be shown in the appropriate species showmanship class to qualify for Breeding Classes. See each division for qualifications.
- A 4-H/FFA member may show a leased horse in Showmanship. Please check in the 4-H/FFA Horse Show Section for the Horse leasing qualifications.
- EXCEPTION: Illness of exhibitor, with a written note from physician, or 4-H member attending the 4-H State Leadership Conference excludes them from Showmanship, but the exhibitor's animal must be shown by a 4-H or FFA member in the Market Class.

AUCTION BYLAW CHANGE - In order to sell an animal in the Plumas-Sierra Junior Livestock Auction, a youth exhibitor must be a resident of Plumas or Sierra County or have been enrolled in a school in Plumas or Sierra County the calendar year of the auction. Youth exhibitors, and their siblings, who sold in the 2022 Plumas-Sierra County Fair Junior Livestock Auction may continue to sell at future auctions in which they are otherwise eligible. Youth exhibitors must also be a member in good standing of a Plumas-Sierra County 4-H club, a Plumas or Sierra FFA chapter, or be an independent exhibitor who has met all requirements outlined in the PSJLA Policy & Procedures Appendix A.



#### **Adult's Code of Conduct**

As the parent, guardian, leader or advisor of an animal exhibitor in the Plumas Sierra County Fair:

I believe my child should demonstrate his or her own ability, knowledge, and skill as a feeder, fitter, and show person of a show animal. I understand that no adult may participate in my child's duty of washing, grooming, fitting, handling, or showing of his or her animal while at the fair.

I will ensure that my child follows the competition rules, and does not use abusive, questionable or unethical techniques in the feeding, caring, fitting, or showing of any animals. I will ensure that my child does not resort to fraudulent, illegal or deceptive practices while fitting or preparing the animal for show and will follow withdrawal protocol.

I have read and understand all of the rules and regulations found in the Exhibit Guide.

#### I realize that my child is responsible for:

- 1. The proper care and humane treatment of animals before, during, and after exhibition and sale.
- 2. The production of wholesome food when the exhibit animal is designated for market.

I will conduct myself at all times to be a credit to my child's organization, chapter, club, school, community, and family. I will follow proper procedures and chain of command if there is a conflict. I will not post negative comments or conflict on social media.

I am aware that **responsible alcohol use** is allowed on the fairgrounds and I will limit my use of alcohol so that I set a proper example for my child and the children of others around me. I shall ensure that other adults are equally responsible in the use of alcohol around my child. I shall not use any drugs that are considered illegal at the federal, state or local level while on the fairgrounds.

I understand that direct criticism or **interference with the judge**, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect. I will not allow any person connected with my child's project to direct abusive or threatening conduct toward any show official. Protest rules can be found in the Entry Guide.

I understand and agree that **if I**, my child, my child's supervisor or leader or any other adult or minor connected with my child's project or animal(s) **break the rules**, I will accept the final decision of the Fair Management regarding the disqualification of my child and or the animal, the loss of prizes, the forfeiture of auction participation, loss of future eligibility, and forfeiture of any monetary award(s).

I understand that my minor child will not stay overnight at the Fairgrounds without their parent or guardian present.

I accept that **these entries are subject to the rules** and regulations as published in the official Exhibit Guide. I further declare that all statements made in connection with my child's entries are true.
