Purpose of the Sweetheart of the Mountains Scholarship Competition

This competition is an opportunity for young ladies to show their communication skills as a spokesperson for small county fairs, specifically the Plumas Sierra County Fair. It is a scholarship competition based on positive attributes that reflect well on where we live.

Eligibility

The Sweetheart of the Mountains Scholarship Competition is open to any naturally born genetic female between the ages of 16 and 20 at the time of the competition. She must be a resident of Plumas or Sierra Counties and be accepted or will be accepted at a qualifying institution for the school year beginning in fall 2024. Qualifying institutions may include a two-year or four-year college or university, vocational or technical school; or other accredited programs.

Judging

A total of three judges will independently assess each contestant's essay and assign it a score of between 1 and 10, with ten being the highest grade. Scores will be totaled and the highest shall be named Sweetheart of the Mountains. In the case of a tie, each judge will be asked to rank the tied essays against each other.

What is expected of the Sweetheart of the Mountains and the First Runner-Up?

The contestant crowned Sweetheart of the Mountains will be expected to promote and represent the Plumas Sierra County Fair for the period of time between the competition and the Fair. These responsibilities would include appearing in local parades throughout Plumas and Sierra Counties. She would need to be well informed about the 2024 Fair and be available for any media requests for interviews. She should appear at the Fair for at least two days by greeting visitors at the Main Gate for two hours daily. The Sweetheart of the Mountains would also appear at any presentations made during the Fair and would be expected to wear her sash throughout the week. She would be in the Fair Parade and finally, make an appearance at the livestock auction.

If she cannot attend a scheduled event, the First Runner-Up will fulfill her duties. In most cases, the First Runner-Up will also be invited to attend these events with the Sweetheart of the Mountains.

As an active, involved individual, we would expect there to be conflicts in scheduling for the Sweetheart of the Mountains. The organizers of the competition will do their utmost to work around other commitments, however, they ask that before a girl applies to compete she consider whether or not she can fulfill most of her duties if she is crowned Sweetheart of the Mountains.

What is at stake?

The top point contestant will receive an educational scholarship of \$500. First Runner Up receives \$250. Funds will be paid after recipients provide proof of enrollment at a qualifying institution.
