### **Rules & Regulations for Clothing & Textiles:**

All entries in these divisions must have been home-produced by the exhibitor(s) within two years (five years for quilts, crocheted or knitted bedspreads and table clothes) of the opening day of the Fair and not previously entered in the Plumas-Sierra County Fair to be eligible for premium awards.

Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled, clean, pressed and ready for display. **Please include tag with name, Division #, and Class # for each item entered.**

**Measurements of each Quilt entry must be stated on entry form.** Width by Length. The first three placings in each class are guaranteed to be displayed, all other entries will be displayed as space allows.

Each wall or bed quilt entry must have a 4" sleeve (a tube of cloth) affixed to the top back across the width by either sewing thread or safety pins in order to hang the quilts by dowels.

All picture entries must be framed and ready for hanging to be accepted for exhibit.

Amateurs: A person whose return from sale, if any, does not exceed the cost of all materials and who are not otherwise remunerated on account of engaging in this work except by cash prizes or premium awards. One who does not pursue the craft as a professional.

Professional: A person who engages in an event or activity as a livelihood or for profit rather than a hobby.

All Local Rules and State Rules apply to this entire Home Arts Department.

Copies of the State Rules may be obtained at the Fair Office or at [www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net](http://www.plumas-sierracountyfair.net).

- Entries in this department must be home prepared and canned or packaged by the exhibitor within one-year of the opening dates of the Fair. Items that have been shown at any previous Fairs are not eligible.
- Entry form must list the type of product (fruit, vegetables, preserves, etc. and the method of process used – canning or drying).
- Each entry must be a different product or the same product by a different method.
- Any entry containing meat will be opened at judges discretion.
- Dried products must be in zip-lock bags.
- An exhibit consists of **two** jars or containers for infused vinegar. Dried foods one zip lock bag.
- **Two standard glass containers will be required** for each class throughout the Preserved Foods Department. One for judging and one for display, unless otherwise specified. Clear glass wide or narrow mouth quart – pint or ½ pint mason jars (i.e. – fruits & vegetables – quart jars; jams, & relish – pint or ½ pint jars) are all permitted. Infused Vinegars maybe exhibited in sealable decorative containers. **Please include name, Division #, and Class # on the bottom of each jar.**
- All products being considered for cash awards, which have not otherwise been eliminated from consideration, will be opened. An Exhibit that cannot be opened will be disqualified.
- Low-acid food must be canned under pressure.
- No paraffin seals. All canning exhibits must be in sealed jars.
- Non-acid foods, such as figs, should be made more acidic by adding lemon juice, as directed in the University Agricultural Service leaflet “*Home Canning of Fruits*”.
- Tomatoes and fruits (not including their juices) must be processed in a boiling water bath.
- Opened canned goods must be picked up Tuesday, July 22 from 2 -6 pm.. Fair Management will dispose of items not picked up by Thursday, July 24

**Baked Goods Department Guidelines and Rules:**

- All entries in this department must be home prepared by the exhibitor and from scratch unless otherwise noted.
- No substitutions may be made.
- Plates should be approximately 9 inches in diameter.
- After the baked foods have been judged, a representative size or amount will be placed on display. Remainder of judged entries will be donated to volunteers and Fair staff unless so specified upon entry. Containers not picked up by 7/28/24 will be disposed of unless otherwise approved.
- All food items (except pies) MUST be brought in on a disposable container or disposable plate. Include name, Division #, and Class # on the bottom of each container.
