- Judges will insist upon a high quality of products and materials used in the exhibit. A high-scoring exhibit will be artistically arranged, colorful, attractive and well lit.
- Booths must be designed, constructed and installed by organization members. All materials used in booth decorations must be flame retardant.
- Exhibitors must make arrangements to replace all fruits and vegetables, which deteriorate during the Fair. Where live animals or people are a part of the booth during judging, they must continue as a part of the exhibit for the benefit of the general public. Substitutions may be made.
- Booth size is 8' x 10'. Booth themes do not have to follow Fair Theme. No materials may be permanently installed.

- After the baked goods/food items have been judged, a representative size or amount will be placed on display. Remainder of food item may be picked up no later than Thursday, Aug. 15th. Fair Management will dispose of items not picked up.

Best of Show receives \$5**4-H Food Preservation Guidelines:**

- Entry form must list the type of product (fruit, vegetables, preserves, etc. and the method of process used - canning or drying).
- Low-acid food must be canned under pressure.
- No paraffin seals. All canning exhibits must be in sealed jars.
- Dried products must be in zip-lock bags.
- An exhibit consists of **two** jars, containers or packages except jerky (six strips) and dried fruit (6 to 8 sections).
- Each entry must be a different product or the same product by a different method.
- Jar labels should list type of product and process (i.e. apricot jam - pectin method; apricot halves - water bath processed.)
- Clear glass wide or narrow mouth quart - pint or ½ pint mason jars (i.e. - fruits & vegetables - quart jars; jams & relish - pint or ½ pint jars.)

FAIR CHECKLIST

LIVESTOCK ENTRY CHECKLIST

- Use the entry form titled “Livestock Entry Form”
- Fill out name and address section completely
- If you have a market animal, use the proper Division and Class numbers for your species, and don’t forget to enter the Showmanship Division and Class as well.
- If you are showing more than one species, you must fill out a different entry form for each species.
- There is an entry fee for a market animal, but there is no entry fee for Showmanship.
- You must pay a stall fee for an animal staying at the Fair. The fee is per animal, NOT per stall.
- If you are entering a market animal, you MUST provide a bill of sale with your entry. If you are the breeder, you MUST provide a breeder’s statement with your entry.
- No bill of sale is necessary for a non-market animal.
- There is a Code of Conduct each exhibitor AND parent must complete and provide with your entry. One parent can sign the parental Code of Conduct, two is better.
- Remember, you must show to sell.

LIVESTOCK DEADLINE FOR ENTRY IS JUNE 21

FAIR CAMPING CHECKLIST

- Your 2019 Fair Camping Application must be turned in to the Fair Office before March 29. The form is available on the Fair Website.
- Previous year campsites will be held as long as possible, but cannot be guaranteed after March 29.
- Requests for campsites can be made, but not guaranteed. Previous year campers cannot “pass on” their campsites to specific individuals.
- Fill out application completely and sign on back.
- A photocopy of your proof of insurance MUST be provided with your application, or send a \$10 MONEY ORDER made out to C.F.S.A. to purchase insurance.
- A check for \$140.00 made out to P.S.C.F. MUST be sent in with your application.
- Months of work go into assigning campsites, PLEASE do not make arrangements to switch campsites without Fair approval. Knowingly moving campsite names can result in losing your own campsite for the Fair. Plus, it’s embarrassing.
