The two counties have shared the name since the mid-90's, but their involvement goes back to the very beginning. Loyaltown and the Sierra Valley especially have been a huge part of the event. Generations of 4H and FFA families have made the trip the second week in August and camped while showing their livestock. The truth is, it would not be half the Fair without involvement from Sierra County.

In an effort to keep that connection strong, the bylaws of the Plumas Sierra Fair Board call for three directors from Sierra County. Those positions have been vacant for many years. The importance of having that representation of Sierra County on the Board can not be understated. The Fair Board's decisions control one of the largest events in either county, having a huge impact on our economy. It is the Fair Board that makes sure our children have a facility and event for their agricultural studies and activities. The Fair Board protects our citizens by making sure the 62 acre facility is run efficiently and honestly.

The position takes relatively little time; the Board meets once a month in Quincy. During Fair time and other large events, Directors have additional duties, mainly meeting the public. They are expected to represent the Fair in their community and assist in fundraising. The Board is looking for individuals with a background in finance, small business, or insurance.
